The 6th World Congress on Allelopathy Is Sailing Smoothly

The 6th World Congress on Allelopathy will be held in Guangzhou, China in December 15-19, 2011. Many registration forms are coming in and distinguish keynote speakers have promised to deliver their speeches. Financial arrangement is coming from different resources.

According to the secretary of the congress, there are already 180 registration forms submitted to the congress so far. The participants are from 30 countries, including Australia, Bangladesh, Belgium, Brazil, Cameroon, Canada, Egypt, Finland, France, Germany, India, Iran, Iraq, Italy, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Korea, Lithuania, Malaysia, México, Poland, Russia, Spain, Sweden, Thailand, Ukraine, United Kingdom, USA and China. Since many potential participants were not aware of the registration deadline in June, we have extended it to July 15, 2011. We expect to have many more participants. Indeed, this will be a large congress that we hope will bring the largest gathering of those interested in allelopathy in history together. If you are interested in allelopathy, we encourage you to make your effort to attend.

Plenary speakers will include several distinguished scientists in the field of allelopathy. For example, Anne Osbourn, John Innes Centre, Norwich Research Park UK; Xiao-ya Chen, Institute of Plant Physiology and Ecology (IPPE), China; David Wardle, Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences, Sweden; Stephen Duke, Natural Products Utilization Research Unit, USDA-ARS; Francisco A. Macias, University of Cadiz, Spain.

I trust you are aware of the upcoming 6th World Congress on Allelopathy (WCA) in December 15-19, 2011 to be organized by Professors Shi-ming Luo and Ren-Sen Zeng of South China Agriculture University, Guangzhou, China on behalf of International Allelopathy Society (IAS). This is to inform you that we are planning to publish a special issue of the journal *Plant and Soil* (PLSO) on Allelopathy with selected papers presented at the WCA and some other invited papers. Dr. Prasanta Bhowmik, Professor, Department of Plant, Soil and Insect Sciences at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, USA, and I will be working as Guest Editors for this special issue. On behalf of the co-editor and the 6thWCA organizing committee, I would like to invite you to attend this congress and present your research. Please visit the above website and note the due dates for abstract submission, congress registration and logistical information such as accommodation in and travel to Guangzhou. December is a lovely time in Guangzhou, called the City of Flowers in southern China. Guangzhou is also known for its generous hospitality and fine food.

Based on your expertise and contributions in the field, I would like to invite you and your coworkers to submit a manuscript to be considered for publication in the Special Issue. I hope you would be able to accept this invitation. Let me explain the process a bit here. At this stage, we are asking you to submit a title and type of your (review or data paper) contribution for the special issue just to check if similar titles have been covered recently to avoid any duplication of topics. The theme of the Special Issue will be *Allelopathy: Ending the era of skepticism in favor of discovery and practical problem solving*. We would encourage you to fit your manuscript to this theme. If accepted you will be invited to submit your manuscripts by January 15, 2012 directly to the Plant and Soil website (Editorial Manager) with a copy to me, indicating that your submission is for the Special Issue on Allelopathy. All manuscripts will undergo regular peer-review to ensure that the Special Issue achieves high quality.

Please note that this invitation does not include any financial assistance to attend the congress in the form of travel grants or waiving of registration fees. Our main reason for writing this invitation letter to you is to generate interest and attracting high quality papers for the Special Issue of PLSO. Please understand that the Guest Editors do not hold any funds. Nonetheless, we hope that our invitation will help you obtain the necessary travel grants from your organization to attend this important congress and contribute to the special issue.
